He made several important contributions to economics, particularly in the study of income distribution and in the analysis of individuals' choices. Development of Sociology. Sociology is the youngest of the recognized social sciences. Auguste Comte in France coined the word 'sociology' in his Positive Philosophy published in 1838. He believed that a science of sociology should be based on systematic observation and classification not on authority and speculation. Sociology As Interpretative Discipline. The positivistic approach to sociology tends to assume that society can shape the behavior of its members almost completely through socialization. Pareto efficiency or Pareto optimality is a state of allocation of resources from which it is impossible to reallocate so as to make any one individual or preference criterion better off without making at least one individual or preference criterion worse off.
