Gustave Flaubert (French: [ʒystav flobɛʁ]; 12 December 1821 – 8 May 1880) was a French novelist. Highly influential, he has been considered the leading exponent of literary realism in his country. He is known especially for his debut novel *Madame Bovary* (1857), his *Correspondence*, and his scrupulous devotion to his style and aesthetics. *Flaubert: A Biography*.
